MEMORANDUM FOR SEE DISTRIBUTION

SUBJECT: The U.S. Army Security Assistance Training Management Organization (SATMO)/G3/5/7, U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command (TRADOC), Transfer to the U.S. Army Security Assistance Command (USASAC)/U.S. Army Materiel Command (AMC)

1. To improve the Army's security assistance operations and continue our efforts to work to improve business processes to achieve efficiencies, SATMO transferred to AMC (USASAC) beginning 1 October 2010. Transferring SATMO to USASAC best facilitates and synchronizes SATMO's in-country training in support of Foreign Military Sales (FMS) cases developed and executed by USASAC.
2. The Memorandum of Agreement transferring SATMO to USASAC has been signed by both TRADOC and AMC. The transfer consolidates all Outside the Continental United States (OCONUS) training/advisory functions with delivery of Army defense articles and services under the single Army functional command, USASAC, with SATMO as a subordinate command. This command and control relationship best leverages the in-country integration of equipment delivery with training/advisory teams toward host country initial operations capability and better synchronizes/strengthens in-country FMS case activities.
3. For the last several months, AMC, TRADOC and USASAC led a working group of process and functional subject matter experts to develop a transitional process and implementation plan to help ensure the transition processes migrate seamlessly and smoothly. OCONUS training cases will migrate to USASAC, and Continental United States (CONUS) training case management and development will remain the responsibility of the Security Assistance Training Field Activity.
4. To make certain the transition is conducted smoothly and efficiently, the transfer will occur in three phases.
 - a. Phase 1, Development and Implementation Plan, included a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) establishing the authorities and responsibilities between TRADOC and AMC, Table of Distribution and Allowances and mission. The MOA was signed 28 September 2010.
 - b. On 1 October 2010, Phase 2 began the financial aspect of the transfer. The Security Assistance Training Field Activity will continue to maintain financial operations, to include funds distribution and execution for SATMO, until the General Fund Enterprise Business System (GFEBS) migration to USASAC. Anticipated implementation date is 1 October 2011.

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c. Phase 3, is anticipated 1 October 2011, with full Army SA Enterprise implementation of GFEBs, along with the complete transfer of "new/initial" SATMO FMS process, mission and funds control and distribution to USASAC. This will complete total transfer and implementation of policy and process documented and established.

5. To ensure all OCONUS training is documented in accordance with established policy and procedures, USASAC will implement a new "D" case designator and Military Article and Service Listing (MASL) OCONUSFMSTRNG, MASL Description OCONUS FMS Training, SATMO. LORs received on or after 1 October 2010 will be written with "D" case designator and the aforementioned corresponding OCONUS training MASL.

6. In order to make the transition of SATMO to USASAC as smooth as possible, most of the current processes will be used. The current USASAC LOR submission process will be used for the development of LOAs and provide for a single LOR receiving point.

7. All LORs, whether provided through formal correspondence or via formal written discussions, e-mail or message, will be sent to the following single LOR entry and processing point: USASAC-LOR-INBOX@conus.army.mil.

8. In accordance with Army Regulation 12-7, Security Assistance Teams, Team Request Memorandums (TRMs) will be processed from the Security Cooperation Office (SCO) to their respective Combatant Commander (COCOM) for validation and endorsement. The COCOM will forward the TRM, with the LOR as an enclosure, to the Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Army for Defense Exports and Cooperation (DASA DE&C) for coordination with selected Headquarters, Department of the Army staff elements. Upon approval by DASA DE&C, the TRM will be tasked through the U.S. Army Materiel Command to USASAC for SATMO execution. SCOs, in coordination with the respective country representatives, have direct line of authority with SATMO to determine requirements and maintain informal dialog in order to obtain a TRM that is executable and meets the country training needs.

9. We recognize that our responsibility does not end with publication of this guidance. Implementing these standards and procedures and ensuring compliance are equally important, and USASAC will work with the entire Security Cooperation Community to make sure this new policy is consistently and fairly applied.

10. Detailed implementing guidance on this initiative will be issued separately. All addressees are strongly encouraged to use the information provided to discuss with your international customers.
